All of Us Research Program® Deputy Director

With nation-wide responsibility for improving the health and well-being of all Americans, the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) oversees the biomedical research programs of the National Institutes of Health (NIH) and those of NIH's research Institutes and Centers (ICs). As the world's largest medical research facility, NIH consists of 27 ICs including the Clinical Center (an on-site research hospital).

This position offers a unique and exciting opportunity for a leader to provide program development and management for the diverse, highly complex *All of Us* Research Program.

This position is in the *All of Us* Research Program, within the NIH Office of the Director, and is responsible for the overall stewardship of all activities under NIH's *All of Us* Research Program. The *All of Us* Research Program is building an engagement and digital data platform, enabling studies on what will be one of the world's largest, most diverse biomedical data sets. *All of Us* will engage one million or more U.S. volunteers of all life stages, health statuses, races/ethnicities, geographic regions, etc., reflecting the rich diversity of America. Mobilizing rich and constantly evolving data - from electronic health records, biospecimens, questionnaires, to physical evaluations, sensors, and other technologies. The Program will support research at the intersection of lifestyle, environment, and genetics to produce new knowledge, leading to the development of innovative prevention strategies and treatments for foundational health challenges.

We are looking for applicants with a commitment to scientific excellence and the energy, enthusiasm, and innovative thinking necessary to lead a dynamic and diverse organization.

Applicants must possess a Ph.D., M.D., or equivalent experience in a field of health science plus senior-level scientific experience and knowledge of research programs in one or more areas related to precision medicine. The incumbent must demonstrate interdisciplinary scientific expertise, strong management skills, exceptional talents and experience in the promotion of effective collaboration with multiple stakeholders (including research participants and their representatives). The incumbent should have a demonstrated track record of accomplishment and vision within one or more key areas related to the *All of Us* Research Program, with success in tackling large-scale problems using

new and innovative approaches. Mastery of the principles, concepts, methods, and techniques of one or more key research fields related to precision medicine is required. The incumbent should be well known and well respected nationally for the innovations created by his or her work and expertise.

The successful candidate for this position will be appointed at a salary commensurate with his/her qualifications and experience, and a full Federal benefits package is available including: leave, health and life insurance, retirement, long term care insurance, and savings plan (401k equivalent).
